Ten students graduate from Pauline Institute

Graduation Day and Friends' Day combine for one grand event

"To God be the glory, great things He has done" – that was our song as the Friends' Day and Pauline Institute Graduation drew to a close. In the cool and inviting environment of the Hotel Joecarl, God was on our side and we had a good number of friends turn up. Some of the students also had friends and family join in with the celebration.

Rev. Dr. Kofi Ahlijah of Meaningful Life was the guest speaker and charged the graduating students to hold the torch of the gospel by not just being a "full time missionary" but become the salt and light of the world by influencing the Market

The gathering was enlivened with John Wesley's cross-generational song "A charge to keep I have, A God to glorify, A never dying soul to save, And fit it for the sky." The Chairman for the occasion was Dr. Ebenezer Inkoom of the Inkoom Hospital who has pledged his outfit's readiness to support the work of missions in unreached places with medical work and presence.

The General Overseer, Apostle Sampson

Dorkunor highlighted what the LBM achieved through the 2015-2016 year under review. Appreciations were rendered to friends who have over the years supported the work in diverse ways. He reported on the work in new fields and among children, evangelistic outreaches, the release of new staff into the fields and the LBM's 20 acre farm project located in Ve Kolenu in the Hohoe District of the Volta Region. This project has great potential as an income generating activity to support the dire need for financial support of the work force. A tractor and well are needed for this project to progress in a grand style.

Sampson also reported on the value of the collaborative ministry with other stakeholder partnerships

the LBM currently have.

He called for intensive prayers for people of other faiths and unreached people in Ghana and beyond – especially the Fulani people group which has been on the LBM Prayer Platform for some few years. . Isaiah 60:6-7

Of the 10 students that graduated from the Pauline Institute, eight were available and graduated with a Diploma in World Missions.

The Pauline Institute was formerly known as the Missions Training Program (MITRAP). The revised and updated course now has two major focuses – Missionary faculty and Biblical Theology faculty.

Vision: To train Christians (international, cross-cultural and inter-denominational) to understand the basic principles of world evangelization and become committed to the task of winning the unreached people to Christ. Mission: MITRAP exists to prepare men and women to launch into the deep and do exploits for the Lord in the end-time harvest of souls.

Motto: Raising a people for the nations

Philosophy: Each believer is a student of God's word and must be a bridge to other people during his lifetime only. In knowing the Lord Jesus Christ, we make Him known. The course also draws heavily on the practice of Christianity in the missionary context. As such, issues related to cultures and development of communities will be given priority. The impact of the gospel in the cultural context is explored. On account of the philosophy, most of the lecturers are drawn directly from missionary fields with practical impartation as well as strong academic backgrounds in what they teach. A strong basis for all of the training is Bible Survey & Bible Study Methods to give adequate equipping.

History: The Missions Training Program began in 2001. The focus of the training program is not just to give head knowledge but to inform students of the needs of the unsaved and unreached people in our generation. It is a response to the absence of missionary training that is Biblical, field-focused and teaches on Church Planting as God's means of possessing the land. It all started as a short term training limited to six (6)

months of full time work. It currently runs for nine (9) months and additional field experience before graduation. It has been open to foreign student participation and enculturation.

Pastor Richard Acolatse is the Dean of students and has been teaching courses on Biblical Theology.
