Living Bread Missions includes working to reach the unsaved and supporting workers in the field

1. **Prayer walks.** As we send this news, we have just finished our walk with Ramadan fasting and prayer. For 30 days we have prayed along with them for the Lord to show Himself strong and bring peace to the world as well as give LIGHT on the path of all mankind. The world needs the Prince of Peace now than ever in the history of the world.

2. **LBM Farms** – a project focused on income generation to support the work of missions. The 20 acre project is located in the Ve Kolenu community of the Hohoe District in the Volta Region. Elder Patrick and Beatrice Adatsi are the Farm overseers. In this season, we have cultivated five acres of maize. We also have some animal husbandry going on. The land holds great potential for income as the agronomist report indicates that “the land is good for commercial cultivation of mangoes, yam, onions and other vegetables. The swampy area can be used for dry season vegetable production.” We see this farm as the jar of oil that the prophet's widow had (2 Kings 4:1-7). What we need is the resources to cultivate and develop the necessary facilities which will support the farmers.

Critical Resource Needs: A borehole and a good tractor

Other Plans: As we have done in the past, we desire to use the farm as a demonstration farm for farmer education in the area. As a mission, we believe in development of the people and the community so that total life transformation will be enforced. As

the gospel goes, so goes economic and social transformation for the benefit of all. "How God anointed Jesus Christ of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power and how He went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with Him" Acts 10:38. Before heaven, new believers must live and take care of their earthly needs.

3. Partnership and Collaboration with Reaching the Unreached:

The visit to Sawla – When the 4X4 stopped, we had to deploy bicycles, heads and feet to reach Chanayiri with the gospel and gifts. We are glad to report that a short trip to the Sawla-Tuna-Kalba area was successful. Accompanied by a couple who decided to take a "field immersion," we visited three main areas – Siti-poue, Ongoli and Chanayiri all in the Northern Region of Ghana. Missionary Stephen and Esther Abouni have been in this field for over 16 years, laboring among the Birifor. We did leadership training as well as visits to the churches and outreach to the community. The LBM's Mission Resource Center project was emphasized during the Friends' Day in May and some partners donated used clothing and other assorted gifts which were sent to the fields and distributed among all ages.

We again partnered with the GHAFES in preparing students for the SICE (field experience and missions) which took place in the Krachi East District of Ghana.

Good reports came from the field leadership of what this partnership/ outreach has done over the years. The General Secretary, Victor Obeng reported recently “kindly pray with the GHAFES SICE missionaries that the Lord will strengthen the teams to keep on sharing the gospel in the Krachi area. We are in 21 different camps. Pray against sickness among some of the teams and that the Lord will heal any missionary that is not well on the field. Pray also for the many fetish groups who are afraid of death should they accept the Gospel. This fear of death and threat among them has affected the growth of the Church in this part of the country. Finally, that through us the Lord will liberate many who have been bound by idol worship and Islam, especially the elderly.”

Great testimonies are coming from previous work done by the student missionaries. A fetish priest who was witnessed to 2 years ago but resisted the gospel found himself in a matter between life and death – he remembered the message of the missionaries and realized he needed Jesus Christ. “He went to a Deeper Life Church near him and converted to Christ. He is now serving in the Church fervently”.

Sampson had the opportunity to speak at various events on Missions; including addressing the issue of Migration and Missions with the AME Zion Church, Western West Africa Episcopal District. Thanks to the Bishop and leadership of the Church for the fellowship offered.

successful celebration of what the Lord has done over the years. We say thanks to all friends and partners in this regard.

5. Pauline Institute Classes in Session – About 15 new students have enrolled in the Pauline Institute and are undergoing missionary training in preparation for the field work soon. This batch will be finishing with their course in December 2016 before taking their practical field attachment.
