New workers are commissioned for the harvest



1. When Discipleship Pays

After 22 years of active involvement in training missionaries, sending them to the field and working along with them to disciple indigenes, the work of Reaching the Unreached has taken a new direction. A total of 37 new workers have officially been ushered into the ministry. Four of the 37 are already designated as missionaries as they coordinate an area of the ministry. Others are called directly into the Pastoral Ministry of giving care and covering to the local churches planted over time. Some of such Pastors are also in charge of two or three local churches and are expected to mobilize such local churches for further church planting in accordance with principles for multiplying the results of missions beyond the unreached communities.

This work of ministry is mainly under the auspices the Reaching the Unreached Ministry based in the USA. It became a collaboration with LBM when God brought together Sampson, Rodney and Malinda Hinrichs in Minneapolis, Minnesota, in 2002. Sampson was then commissioned by the Harvest Network International. He was later asked to coordinate the work in Northern Togo, Northern Ghana and now Cote

D'Ivoire and Burkina Faso along with Rev Ahmed Adjei of Straightway Chapel. The journey has been tough but very rewarding over the years. We rejoice to work along with Tim and Bev Nappe, of Milford, Iowa, the current field directors of the work.

2. Banda Chapel

Named after the late Missionary Ebenezer Obeng Amoah. Ebenezer who served in the Banda communities, died in Techiman just about a month after sending his resignation letter to the office. His labour of handling tough terrain (in Gbao, Bongase, Ahenkro, Nyire and Sabiye) was brought into sharp focus and the leadership decided to honor him by assigning the new chapel built in Banda Gbao after him. Ebenezer is survived by the wife Esther and the only daughter, Angel Obeng Amoah (eight years old). It must be remarked that the Church left behind in Gbao did their best to mobilize for the building the chapel to house their worship services and two of Ebenezer's disciples have been licensed as Pastors. The current missionary to the area, Francis Akoliga testifies to the hard work of Ebenezer.



3. Dawa Church is doing well.

After the start of this new work in the Dangme land, we have seen consistency in the operations of the local branch. The first batch of members are being prepared for baptism as a declaration of their new-found faith in Christ Jesus the Lord. Some supplies have been provided for the growth of the local branch.



4. Funeral for the late Mr. Paul Nuhoho

September 2018 also marks a time when Janet and I bid farewell to the late Mr. Paul Nuhoho (the father of Janet). He lived for a whopping 95 years and had gone to be with the Lord.
